Public Works and Arena Operation Verbal Reports

CAO, on behalf of Public Works, verbally reported the following information to Council:

- Due to the new water filtration media our new baseline for water turbidity is 0.15 to 0.18 noting that the baseline used to be 0.30 to 0.38.
- ➤ Calcium Chloride for Anderson Avenue was picked up August 26th and applied on 28th.
- > times while crew was preparing Anderson Avenue for dust control.
- > The grader needs a new blade in 2020 as it's showing significant wear.
- monitoring the crew's activities on a regular basis.
- Replacement window for the dump truck was ordered August 27th.
- > Water Turbidity meter couriered to ClearTech for calibration.
- > Railway Avenue back-bladed and graded.

- Main Street repaired across from WTP as the OSS waste collection truck had destroyed it.
- All-Stat Electric confirmed their quote to connect the recreation complex to our emergency generator remains the same. Two other electricians were contacted for quotes but declined submission after checking the work needed.
- > The lift station is operating as it should.
- Speed Bump on Railway Avenue was installed Sept 4th
- > Remainder of planter blocks were picked up at McMunn & Yates in Yorkton, plus the replacement window for dump truck and fluorescent bulbs and ballasts.
- The logistics of fabricating and installing street height restriction gates was discussed.
- Light bulbs and ballasts replaced in council chambers and library on September 9th.
- ➤ Lobby door to the arena ice area was found "a-jar" and unlocked, noting that it was securely locked on Saturday September 7th.
- First week of October is the scheduled start-up for the ice-plant.
- > Big information sign needs welding as the frame was wind damaged.
- ➤ Well #3 is now in operation.

b) Fall Prevention

c) WHIS

One morning course at Parkland College in Yorkton on Oct 25th for \$60.00 The PW Assistant has the course, but the Foreman needs to take it.

d) Landscape Applicator (Pest-172CE)

On-line program (anytime) that the PW Assistant is willing to take at a cost of \$300.00 – only one employee is required to have certification for this course.

e) Confined Space

1-day course at Parkland College in Yorkton on Oct 24th at \$225.00 per registrant. Both PW staff are required to take the course.

f) H2S Alive

1-day course that both PW staff members are required to take (\$225.00 each) Dates: Sept 23rd or Oct 21 at Parkland College and/or Oct 25th at RCM Safety in Yorkton.

g) ½ Mask Respirators & Fit Test

Safety Warehouse in Yorkton. Registrants must email medical forms to be completed prior to taking the course. Both employees required to have this. Respirators cost - \$24.00 each plus taxes

Fit Test cost - \$105.00 each taxes included.

h) PPE for Water Plant

This safety clothing protects staff from the water treatment chemicals used in the WTP such as potassium promaginate, hydro chloric acid and sodium hypochloride (chlorine)
